











Celebration of International Day of Peace

18-21 September 2024, Mostar

The Network for Building Peace, United World College (UWC) Mostar, forumZFD in Bosnia and Herzegovina (Forum Civil Peace Service), and the Local Democracy Agency Mostar (LDA Mostar), with the support of the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) and the Rockefeller Brothers Fund, are organizing the celebration of the International Day of Peace on September 21, and UWC Day on September 21.

During the event, the 'Goran Bubalo Peace Award' will be presented, and the 'Global Campaign for Peace Education' will be marked on September 20. Additionally, there will be educational activities, conferences, theatrical performances, and workshops attended by students from 72 different countries, including those from regions currently experiencing conflicts. We will conclude the event with a rock concert aimed at young people and anyone who feels young at heart.


The first 'Peace Conference,' organized by UWC Mostar, was held last year in Mostar. The Days of Peace will provide an additional opportunity to promote peace and reconciliation in the country and the region, and to call upon decision-makers to resolve conflicts peacefully.

On this occasion, we are gathering peace activists, teachers, experts, educators, and young activists. We invite all **representatives from the formal and informal education sectors, civil society organizations, and interested individuals** to join us for the Days of Peace in Mostar.

Local Works is a five-year program funded by the United States Agency for International Development (<u>USAID</u>) aimed at empowering local communities. By providing assistance and support to communities in Bosnia and Herzegovina, we develop capacities that enable sustainable growth, increased civic engagement, and mobilization of available local resources. The Local Works web platform facilitates the exchange of information among all stakeholders and maps relationships and influences within civil society, public and local institutions, as well as the business sector for local initiatives in Bosnia and Herzegovina. Partner organizations in the program include the Center for Civic Cooperation Livno (CGS Livno), the Network for Building Peace, the Institute for Youth Development KULT, the Tuzla Community Foundation, and the Mozaik Foundation. These organizations address development challenges in their own communities and work on fostering philanthropy. USAID has invested a total of \$12 million in the Local Works program.



Plays:

"Game" -Mostar Youth Theatre

In 2021, the Mostar Youth Theatre created the play 'Game' based on the testimonies of refugees who were staying at the 'Salakovac' refugee camp near Mostar. The play was developed as part of the IMPACT project, which is conducted by the Local Democracy Agency Mostar.

"The bitter flame" ("Gorki plamen") -DiS Banja Luka

The play is based on the life of one of the most important poets of our region, Aleksa Šantić. Its contemporary staging is notable for its innovative approach that blends the past and present through a rich tapestry of emotions, movement, sound, and color. Our goal with the play 'Bitter Flame' is to connect Šantić's emotional and romantic sorrows with modern times. We aim to show how universal themes of love, longing, and suffering are reflected today, despite changes in the social context. The performance incorporates various artistic disciplines – from literature and music to dance and visual arts.

"25 glasses of wine" ("25 Čaša vina") -DAH Theatre

Created to mark the quarter-century of DAH Theatre's work, this lecture-performance by director Dijana Milošević is based on autobiographical texts. In it, she discusses the work of a theater troupe that emerged in the specific historical and political context of 'a country that no longer exists.' Through the existence and work of this theatre troupe, the history of a country is reflected, as well as the global moment in which we live.

"The Land" ("Zemlja") - DAH Theatre

The performance "The Land" combines the practices of stewardship, care for plants, and the earth (Latin: TERRA) with stories of migration and emigrants, reflecting on the effort, pain, and adjustment involved in 'transplanting' that occurs during the migration process, especially in cases of forced relocation."













Movie – "Bridges" ("Mostovi") – *Citizens' Initiative Mostar*

It portrays the unification of women in Mostar with the aim of helping their fellow citizens secure maternity benefits. Through this initiative, women come together to fight for their rights and improve social conditions for mothers in their community. The film highlights the importance of solidarity and collective action in achieving social justice and women's rights.


Concert -Band UWC; KICK Kakanj; Mostar Rock school; Pop-Rock school Sarajevo; Rock school Birač Region

At the concert, musicians will celebrate peace through their performances and use art to advocate for reconciliation. Their songs and performances will serve as bridges connecting people, promoting understanding and unity among different communities while delivering a universal message of peace and hope for a better future.

Living library - Helsinki Citizens' Assembly Banja Luka

Living Library is an innovative event that allows for direct encounters with people whose stories and experiences serve as 'living books.' Instead of reading, participants listen to personal narratives that help overcome prejudices, build peace, and connect individuals. This storytelling format offers an opportunity for a deeper understanding of diverse perspectives, fosters empathy and dialogue, and facilitates inspiring conversations and the formation of new friendships.
