Dear Friends of UWC Mostar,

If one theme defined this year, it was undoubtedly Peace and Conflict. While long-standing conflicts persisted with little hope of resolution, new ones emerged, dividing the world and fueling tensions across various communities, including academic campuses worldwide. Advances in generative AI, notably ChatGPT becoming the fastest-growing application in history, sparked a different kind of conflict—some felt threatened by the technology, while others embraced it too quickly, raising concerns that young people might neglect foundational skills in favor of relying on tools to perform tasks.

At UWC Mostar, the theme of peace is woven deeply into our work. One highlight of the year was the Peace Conference, conceptualized and organized under the leadership of our staff member and UWC alumna Dasha Davidouskaya to mark UWC Day. The event was a resounding success, not just in its execution but in the energy and collaboration leading up to it. With an inspiring keynote speech by Faith Abiodun, Executive Director of the UWC International Office, dynamic panel discussions featuring educators and grassroots peace workers from Mostar and Bosnia and Herzegovina, and workshops led by our staff, students, and external organizations, the conference exemplified the ethos of UWC Mostar. We are hopeful this will become an annual tradition, setting the tone for the year as it did so powerfully this time.

This year also marked a significant milestone—the 10th anniversary of the UWC Mostar Endowment. This has been instrumental in ensuring the college's financial stability and enabling scholarships for talented students from Bosnia and Herzegovina. We extend our heartfelt gratitude to Adriaan van Otterloo and Fleur Meijs for their visionary leadership in creating the Bridge to the Future Endowment. Their generosity and dedication have transformed countless lives by making a UWC education accessible to those who need it most.

At UWC Mostar, our mission is clear: to build bridges between people and cultures through inspiring, high-quality education. This year, our students once again exemplified this mission. 

Foundation Education in Action

The Foundation Education in Action, the legal successor of the Finnish Association "From Conflict to Internationalism," was established to advance educational reform in Bosnia and Herzegovina (BiH). The Foundation's primary aim is to promote the introduction of modern teaching and learning methods in the national curriculum while providing professional development opportunities for educators throughout the country. To date, over 1,000 teachers, headmasters, pedagogical institute employees, and ministers have participated in the workshops, conferences, and study visits organized under the Foundation's umbrella. Through these initiatives, the Foundation continues to foster innovation and inclusivity in education, empowering educators to inspire the next generation of leaders.

Governing Board

The Foundation Education in Action is governed by an international Governing Board comprising of four members, chaired by Dr. Pilvi Torsti. The Foundation was co-founded by Ms. Elisabeth Rehn and Dr. Lamija Tanović, who both bring a wealth of experience and commitment to educational and societal advancement.

Founders:

- · Elisabeth Rehn: A former United Nations Special Rapporteur on the situation of human rights in the Balkans and UN Under-Secretary-General, Ms. Rehn has an extensive understanding of the region. She was the Patron of the UWC-IBO Initiative in BiH and served as Chair of the Association "Education from Conflict to Internationalism."
- Lamija Tanović: A Professor of Physics at the Sarajevo School of Science and Technology and a former Chair of the Executive Committee of the UWC-IBO Initiative, Dr. Tanović also held prominent positions at the BiH Ministry of Foreign Affairs, including Head of the International Department for Education and Culture.

Mission.

The Foundation's mission is to equip the next generations of young people in Bosnia and Herzegovina with the knowledge, skills, leadership qualities, and international values needed to overcome ethnic divides and drive progress into the 21st century.

Chair of the Board:

· Dr. Pilvi Torsti (Finland): Dr. Torsti brings decades of experience in education, governance, and innovation. As the Director of the European Training Foundation and a former State Secretary in Finland, she has contributed significantly to the development of education policies and the UN Agenda 2030 goals. Dr. Torsti played a pivotal role in founding the United World College (UWC) Mostar in 2006 and continues to champion the integration of Finnish educational expertise into global initiatives.

Board Members:

- · Jasminka Bratić (BiH): Former Assistant Minister of Justice for Herzegovina-Neretva Canton and Chair of the UWC Mostar College Board.
- Ivan Lorenčić (Slovenia): A distinguished education expert and former Director of the National Education Institute of Slovenia, Mr. Lorenčić has led professional development programs for teachers in BiH since 2005.
- Adriaan de Mol van Otterloo (The Netherlands): Chief Investment Officer at UWC Endowment, former Trustee of Amera (Africa and Middle East Refugee Assistance), and graduate of UWC Adriatic.

The Foundation Education in Action remains a non-governmental, non-political, and non-profit organization, building on the legacy of the UWC-IBO Initiative, which established UWC Mostar in 2006.

Subcommittees

The subcommittee's task is to act as an advisory body that will propose solutions to any problems encountered in the work of the College at the invitation of the Head of College, or upon the College Board establishing itself that a problem exists, in close communication with the Head of College. UWC Mostar is an integral part of the UWC movement, which was founded in 1962 based on the vision of German educationalist Kurt Hahn. Hahn believed that bringing young people from diverse cultural, religious, and racial backgrounds together could help foster mutual understanding and prevent future conflicts.

In Bosnia and Herzegovina, UWC Mostar's mission extends beyond academic excellence—it aims to influence young people seeking to shape their future in a society still grappling with the legacy of its past. By educating young individuals to appreciate their differences while promoting tolerance, equality, and critical thinking, UWC Mostar plays a pivotal role in reconciliation efforts developing an educational model for post-conflict and transitional societies while serving as an example of integrated education and peaceful coexistence amidst diverse backgrounds.

The college broadens its special mission by extending these transformative opportunities to students from around the world, particularly those from other post-conflict regions, with a focus on the Balkans.

College Board

UWC Mostar is registered as a private secondary school under the law of Bosnia and Herzegovina. The College Board governs the institution, appoints the College Head (with the formal approval of the Foundation Education in Action), and oversees the school's strategic direction.

UWC Mostar is governed by the College Board comprising of 13 members, representing the Founder (the Foundation Education in Action), college staff, parents, UWC International, alumni.

The College Board's responsibilities include appointing the College Head and advising and monitoring the Head's work, adopting policy documents, approving the annual working plan and budget of the school, financial management, and being directly responsible to UWC International for adherence to UWC criteria and standards.


Academic Overview

At UWC Mostar, education is more than academic excellence—it's about nurturing students prepared to create positive change in the world. The International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Programme remains at the core of our academic offerings, with a curriculum designed to foster critical thinking, global awareness, and leadership skills.

Our academic philosophy extends beyond classroom instruction. The Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS) program is a cornerstone of holistic learning, where students engage in meaningful initiatives that benefit both the UWC Mostar and local communities. For example:

- The Peace Conference: Students participate and organize community-wide events promoting dialogue and reconciliation.
- Balkan Studies Course: Students explore the region's history and culture, deepening their understanding of the local context.
- Global Awareness Sessions: Organized by students, these discussions tackle global challenges and foster cross-cultural understanding.

These initiatives embody our mission of working with the Mostar community to build bridges and mutual respect, rather than working solely for the community.



School and University Statistics

UWC Mostar continued to achieve strong academic results in the 2023/2024 academic year, outperforming global averages in the IB Diploma Programme:

- · Number of diploma and retake candidates registered in the session: 96

- · Highest diploma points awarded to a candidate: 44
- · Average grade obtained at the school by candidates who passed the diploma: 5.52

Cooperations and Highlights -Community Engagement and Outreach



UWC Mostar stands out for its extensive range of educational. humanitarian, cultural, outdoor, and sports activities in collaboration with the local community of Mostar, the Herzegovina-Neretva Canton, and partners at the entity and state levels. In this academic year, the college organized more than 100 activities that strengthened its mission of global education and community engagement. In Focus: Professional Development for Teachers from BiH and Ecological Campaign

Professional Development of Teachers



UWC Mostar runs special professional development workshops involving secondary school teachers and educators from across Bosnia and Herzegovina, as part of the College's outreach activities. Through its experience with the IB education model and the UWC ethos, UWC Mostar aims to contribute to the conversation on education reform in Bosnia, by demonstrating the practical aspects of a modern structured curriculum such as the IB. Through series of workshops, UWCM informs teachers about modern educational trends and pedagogical paradigms based on the IB program. These workshops bring together teachers from across BiH also to work together and exchange experiences from their schools." Professional Development Workshops for Physics and Mathematics Teachers

In cooperation with Pedagogic Institutes from Mostar, UWC Mostar organized a Physics workshop attended by 49 elementary and secondary school Physics teachers and a Mathematics workshop with 85 participants from elementary and secondary schools from Herzegovina-Neretva Canton, covering best practices and IB methodologies for the respective subjects.



Future Cooperations

Representatives of the Institute for Education, Pedagogical Institutes Mostar, OSCE Mission to Bosnia and Herzegovina, APOSO - Agency for preschool, elementary and secondary education, Ministry of Education of Western Herzegovina, and representatives of local secondary schools in Mostar, participated in a one-day program visit to UWC Mostar.

The main aim of the event was to focus on future cooperation, teacher professional development, and structured activities.

Ecology projects

Sustainable Cities

Student groups worked together on scientific and technological topics, allowing for concepts and perceptions from across the disciplines to be shared in line with the aim, to "encourage an understanding of the relationships between scientific disciplines and the overarching nature of the scientific method".

The project at UWC Mostar had both a practical and a theoretical angle and allowed students to appreciate the environmental, social, and ethical implications of science and technology. It also allowed them to understand the limitations of scientific study. The emphasis was on interdisciplinary cooperation and the processes involved in scientific investigation.

The aim was to develop and apply the students' information and communication technology skills in the study of science and raise awareness of the ecological, social, economic, and environmental implications of using science and technology.

Research and collaboration focused on sustainable cities and the incorporation of certain facets of sustainability in Urban Living using a City Context.

Cleaner City Campaign

UWC Mostar students and members of the Gimnazija Mostar Eco Section joined together in the school year 2023/2024 for an ongoing activity of cleaning the City of Mostar. This year the joint activities covered the areas of the Old town in Mostar.

The aim of the campaign is raising awareness of the importance of the cleanliness of city surfaces, making Mostar a green city, and taking care of the cultural heritage of the city.







Project Week - Cultivating Awareness, Building Peace, Strength**ening Communities**

Project Week is a hallmark of the UWC co-curricular learning experience, offering students a unique opportunity to push boundaries, discover themselves, and contribute meaningfully to the world around them. This initiative is not just a personal journey—it embodies UWC Mostar's mission by fostering ecological awareness, peacebuilding, and community outreach in Bosnia and Herzegovina.

Students engage in transformative projects across three key categories:

Service Projects:

Through partnerships with local organizations, students address pressing social and environmental issues, such as waste management, reforestation, and youth education. By engaging directly with community members, they develop empathy, cultural sensitivity, and a shared commitment to sustainable development. These projects raise ecological awareness by promoting practices like recycling and conservation while nurturing peace by fostering collaboration and trust.

Expedition Projects:

Students explore the natural beauty and historical landmarks of Bosnia and Herzegovina, often combining adventure with education. Whether trekking through protected natural reserves or visiting sites that reflect the country's complex history, these expeditions encourage a deep appreciation for ecological preservation and cultural heritage. By connecting with the environment and understanding the past, students contribute to a collective vision of peace and coexistence.

Creativity Projects:

Artistic and innovative initiatives during Project Week allow students to express their perspectives on global challenges like climate change and social inequality. Projects such as creating public art installations, hosting cultural exchange workshops, or developing eco-friendly solutions amplify community voices, inspire action, and leave a lasting impact.

Empowering Change Through Outreach

Beyond individual growth, Project Week reinforces UWC Mostar's commitment to outreach and development. By working hand-inhand with local communities, students build bridges across cultures, strengthen relationships, and inspire shared progress. This engagement not only empowers students as changemakers but also helps communities envision sustainable and inclusive futures.

A Legacy of Ecological and Social Awareness

Project Week instills in students and the community alike the values of ecological stewardship, peace, and unity. It exemplifies the transformative power of experiential education, creating ripples of positive change that extend far beyond the UWC campus.

This year the projects recognized for their outreach, ecological and social impact included: Nature Nurturers: Sustainable Agriculture in Association "Nešto Više", Renew and Renovate, Bob the Builder, Walls Can Make a Difference, Native Plants of Herzegovina and Let's Be Sustainable.

Through service, exploration, and creativity, Project Week is a living testament to UWC Mostar's mission to inspire and equip young people to build a more peaceful and sustainable world.

Peace Conference 2023

The first Peace Conference organized by UWC Mostar marked the International Day of Peace and celebrated UWC Day. The conference programme welcomed more than 300 participants, many interesting workshops, and panels with the topics of: "Education as a way to Build Peace" and "Grassroot Peace Building: Experiences from Mostar".

The aims of the conference covered the topics of:

- Thinking beyond the traditional dichotomy of conflict and peace and cultivating an intellectual exchange through the inclusion of diverse perspectives

Bridging Culture Short Course

As a part of our ongoing commitment to fostering positive change and building a more inclusive world, UWC Mostar organizes a "Bridging Cultures" Short Course every summer.

The course aims to equip participants with the skills and knowledge to bridge cultural divides and promote effective communication in diverse settings. The program focuses on key principles of multicultural understanding and nonviolent communication, providing practical tools that can be applied in various personal and professional contexts.

This year we welcomed participants from BiH, Montenegro, Serbia, North Macedonia, and Albania providing them with an opportunity to be a part of interesting workshops, meet peers from the region, talk about identity, non-violent communication, activism, and peacebuilding.

UWC Mostar at Delphi Forum 2024

Four UWC graduates and students, representing UWC Mostar and UWC Maastricht participated in a special panel discussion at the esteemed Delphi Forum 2024. Representing communities in Bosnia & Herzegovina and Cyprus, these UWC panellists explored the transformative power of education in building bridges and helping students act as 'agents of peace'.

The event brought together close to 200 people, including Cypriot and international UWC students, UWC faculty, UWC alumni, Cypriot high school students, educators, civil society partners, and others from both sides of the divide.

This international and intergenerational event provided an inspirational showcase of the transformative power of education in contributing to inter-communal dialogue. It allowed young people to play an active role as agents of change and advocates for peace.

The main themes that were covered at this event were youth inclusion, peace education, and the role of the EU. All five attending UWCs; UWC Mostar, UWC Maastricht, UWC Red Cross Nordic, UWC Adriatic, and UWC Robert Bosch organized UWC Experience workshops led by their students. These gave the Cypriot students from local schools a chance to get a glimpse of life as a student at a UWC.

UWC Mostar students introduced the impact on the community in Mostar by presenting the service CASs as an important part of the outreach work in the community done by students. They also explained how the open campus helps to integrate better with the local community.

UWC Mostar delegation also participated in a Panel Discussion as the first UWC with the explicit aim of contributing to the reconstruction of a post-conflict society.

Bridge to the Future

The UWC Mostar Endowment "Bridge to the Future" was set up in October 2013 with an objective to create an endowment to secure permanent funding for the College.

Bridge to the Future funds scholarships for students to attend UWC Mostar. The endowment has been set up as a charity in the UK to ensure good governance and best-in-class stewardship of donor funds. The capital of the endowment is invested and the income and capital gains are used to distribute to UWC Mostar to cover scholarships. One endowment to provide funding for a scholarship at UWC Mostar every year into perpetuity "costs" €350,000.



What is an **Endowment?**

The endowment is a fund to provide long term financing for scholarships. The gifts of donors become the assets of the endowment and are invested in stock markets and other financial investments. The income and capital gains of the investments are used to make donations to UWC Mostar to cover the costs of students receiving a scholarship. The aim of the endowment is to preserve the value of the assets over the long term.

Since January 2024 the global UWC Endowment Fund, www.uwcendowment. com, manages the endowment funds for other UWCs and UWC International.


Review of the year

Ten years ago, the first students attended UWC Mostar with a scholarship from Bridge to the Future - UWC Mostar endowment in 2014. We celebrated the 10th years' anniversary during the UWC Mostar graduation ceremony in May. Our ambition in 2013 was to raise €30 million and we are getting close with €24.1 million of funds invested.

Over these 10 years, we received €18,5 million in donations, invested these funds generating €9 million in investment returns, used €3,5 million to sponsor 161 students attending UWC Mostar and have a UWC Mostar endowment with net assets of €24 million to continue to provide scholarships into perpetuity.


The investment performance was reasonable with a 8% increase in the 23/24 financial year, with the underlying investments generating on average a 10.4% return. With the launch of the global UWC Endowment Fund in January 2024, Bridge to the Future invests its funds together with endowments of other UWCs.

To illustrate how the endowment works, in the right side is a graph which sets out the impact of a EUR1 million donation in 2014, its growth in income, its expenses in scholarships grants and the current value in Aug 2024.




Number of the **Endowment** scholarships at the start of the school vear

The endowment Board awarded 25 new scholarships to students starting September 2024 and combined with 24 second year students, bringing the total number of students with a scholarship at UWC Mostar from the endowment to 49.








